Meeting Summary

Thoughts on Location:

- Fred has lived in Woodland Lake for 18 years. He has seen the things that happen at the pool after hours. The gate for the pool has been great for keeping unwanted guests out after hours. Fred suggests cameras for after-hours security. This activity ebbs and flows with the kids in the neighborhood. To reduce illegal or unwanted activity he also recommended a motion sensor light.
- Trash cans could be a nice touch so that unwanted trash does not blow through the neighbors' backyards.
- A question was raised about putting a fence around the playground. It has both pros and cons but based on the current budget restraints not a top priority.
- Rubber mulch or Turf. Turf is very expensive.
- It would be nice to have benches and/or picnic tables by playground.

Thoughts on playset types or features:

- There was discussion of vinyl/Pollywood verses a traditional wood playground. The wood requires annual maintenance of varnishing and/or sanding if needed. The wood playset also attracts carpenter bees. The vinyl or Pollywood is typically maintenance free.
- Swings are a must for the playground. A suggestion was to look into getting swings like the playground on lake avenue that has a mother and baby swing.
- Lindsey suggested that dark colors not be used. The green slides at Parkview Park get too hot to use on certain days in the summer.
- The question was raised asking if this would be a pet friendly environment. The consensus is our neighborhood in general is very pet friendly.
